The granting of a Burn Permit by the Hollywood Fire-Rescue and Beach Safety Department is not authorization or license for an event. A Burn Permit from the Hollywood Fire-Rescue and Beach Safety Department evaluates only the safety aspects of the burn and provides a permit for such burn, provided all other municipal, county, state, and federal requirements are met by the petitioner(s).

A Site Plan showing the following must accompany this application:

1. The exact spot where the fire will be on the property.
If the fire will be on a surface other than earth, describe the material i.e. concrete.
2. Any building or other structures that are within 50 yards of the fire and what type of materials they are constructed of.
All structures must be identified as to occupancy type (i.e. single family home).
3. Any roadway public or private in the immediate area (within 300 feet).
4. The location of the nearest fire hydrant.
5. The location of any crowds or similar gatherings that are anticipated and an estimate of their number.

Give brief description of what you plan on doing:

There is a \$50.00 Fee for the Burn Permit.
(City of Hollywood Code of Ordinances 94.173)

A Fire Engine and Crew is required to be present during the burn. You will be billed for this service (approximate cost \$450.00).

A letter from the property owner granting permission to conduct the burn at his/her property must accompany the application. If the property has insurance then they also need a letter from the insurance company stating it is alright to conduct the burn. The letter(s) must be notarized.

A letter from the police department stating they have no objection to the bonfire or celebration, this is required for schools but may also be required for other events.

An **Open Burn License** from the **Broward County Department of Natural Resource Protection, Division of Air Quality** must be obtained.

Once all of the above have been received a determination as to whether a permit will be issued will be made.

If on City of Hollywood property a '**RECREATIONAL BONFIRE ON CITY PROPERTY PERMIT AND INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT**' must be executed.

The permit may be revoked at any time when, in the opinion of the Fire Chief, Fire Marshal or other duly authorized representative of the Fire Department, conditions are such as to create a hazard to the public or the surrounding area.

** No permit will be issued for any bonfire that is closer than 50 yards to any occupied building.
