The City of Hollywood is conducting its Regular City Commission Meetings in-person at City Hall, located at 2600 Hollywood Boulevard. While public access to City Hall and City facilities has resumed, please know that seating inside the Commission Chambers is limited and facial masks are recommended but not required for City employees and visitors.

CITY COMMISSION MEETING

Sun Shuttle

The Mayor and City Commission voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2022-138](#) for the renewal of the City's agreement with Sun Shuttle, which is operated by Circuit Transit, Inc. A fare increase of \$2 per person was implemented. The shuttle service provides transportation services to and from Downtown Hollywood, Hollywood Beach, the City's parking garages, and recently expanded the route to City Hall. From May 2021 through April 2022, the Shuttle provided rides for more than 136,435 passengers.

Sun Shuttle operates Sunday through Thursday from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., and Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. For more information about the Sun Shuttle, please visit hollywoodfl.org.

City Commission Approves Contract for Sidewalk Construction and Resurfacing

The Mayor and City Commission voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2022-143](#) to piggyback on a contract between Concrete Works & Paving, Inc. and Broward County for construction services. The City's current Capital Improvement Program includes the Sidewalk Infill Projects to install new sidewalks along various streets within the City as well as resurfacing various roads and alleys citywide. The approval of this Resolution supplements the City's sidewalk construction efforts and expedites the timeline for completion.

City Commission Appoints Voting Delegate for Florida League of Cities

Commissioner Traci Callari was appointed unanimously as the City's voting delegate for the Florida League of Cities' 2022 Annual Conference, which will be held August 11-13, 2022. Commissioner Callari will vote to elect the League's new leadership and adopt resolutions during the business meeting.



ORDINANCES

Ordinance Amendment to Allow Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages in City Community Facilities Approved on First Reading

On first reading, the Mayor and City Commission approved Ordinance [PO-2022-11](#) to allow consumption or sale of alcoholic beverages at any of the City's community centers or facilities. If approved on second reading, this ordinance amendment would allow alcoholic beverages at our indoor Park Facilities, Golf Courses (both indoor and outdoor) and Arts and Cultural Center (indoors).

PRESENTATIONS, PROCLAMATIONS AND AWARDS

Recognition of Men's Health Month, June 2022

The Mayor and City Commission presented Dr. Ashwin Mehta MD MPH, Medical Director of Integrative Medicine, Medical Director of Physician Wellness at Memorial Healthcare System, with a proclamation recognizing Men's Health Month, which is observed in June. Men's Health Month raises awareness of the health issues men face and encourages them to take a proactive role in their health by focusing on preventative healthcare and lifestyle modification. Congresswoman Frederica Wilson presented the City with a \$1.7 million check for the purchase of Police Body Worn Cameras and associated infrastructure and equipment. This funding is part of the \$1.5 trillion omnibus spending bill signed by President Biden. Congresswoman Wilson and Congresswoman Debbie Wasserman Schultz co-sponsored this request on behalf of the City of Hollywood through the 2022 Community Project Funding Appropriation Request. Todd Delmay, President of the Hollywood LGBTQ+ Council, accepted a proclamation in recognition of Pride Month. Celebrated in June, Pride Month commemorates the historic Stonewall Riot, which was the turning point for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ+) liberation in the United States. The fight for dignity and equality of LGBTQ+ people is reflected in the tireless dedication of advocates and allies who strive to forge a more inclusive society. This month, we recognize the contributions of the LGBTQ+ community in the City of Hollywood and across the nation. On June 1st, the City, in partnership with the Hollywood LGBTQ+ council, held its Progress Pride Flag Raising ceremony to commemorate Pride Month. Hollywood was the first City in South Florida to fly this flag at City Hall. Last year, the City earned a perfect score of 100 on the Human Rights Campaign's Municipal Equality Index – a testament to the City's commitment to the LGBTQ+ community. Presentation by Marty Kiar, Broward County Property's Appraiser's Office

Broward County Property Appraiser Marty Kiar shared information on the City's property values as it relates to the June 1st release of the 2022 Estimate of Taxable Values. Hollywood saw a significant increase in taxable value now estimated to be \$20.783B as of January 1, 2022, which is a 10.4% increase from the prior year. This increase was due to the number of people who are moving into Hollywood and paying top value for their property. In his presentation, Property Appraiser Kiar mentioned some of the programs offered by his office. One new initiative that is available to residents is Owner Alert, a free service designed to help you protect your property from scams or fraud by notifying you if a document is received by BCPA changing the ownership of your property.
