Updates from the City Commission Meeting

The City of Hollywood is conducting its Regular City Commission Meetings in-person at City Hall, located at 2600 Hollywood Boulevard. While public access to City Hall and City facilities has resumed, please know that seating inside the Commission Chambers is limited and facial masks are recommended but not required for City employees and visitors.

CITY COMMISSION MEETING

The City Commission Meeting started with a special moment of silence to remember the life of Driver Engineer Chris Allen who passed away unexpectedly on Monday, June 6th. With 23 years of dedicated service to the Hollywood Fire Rescue and Beach Safety Department, DE Allen was excited to drive the Department's new high-water rescue vehicle during the recent rainstorm two weeks ago. Unfortunately, this would be his last time on-duty. Funeral services were held earlier this week. The City of Hollywood extends our deepest condolences to Chris's wife, children, friends, and his brothers and sisters in the Fire Department.



City Commission Approves Consultant for Radio Tower Design

As part of the Consent Agenda, the Mayor and City Commission voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2022-166](#) for professional engineering services to design a new radio tower for the Hollywood Police Department. This resolution allows staff to work with G.M. Selby, Inc. to design a radio tower that can accommodate the City's required CCTV network, the City's public service radio system, and other required City equipment. The radio tower will be located adjacent to the proposed New Police Headquarters building.

Police Department to Purchase Body Worn Cameras

The Mayor and City Commission voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2022-183](#) to purchase 531 body worn cameras for the Hollywood Police Department. This resolution is part of the Consent Agenda. This digital evidence management system will provide a turn-key solution to capture video from an officer's perspective. The Police Department has identified the Axon Body Work Camera 3 that would meet the Department's operational needs. HPD currently uses the Axon Taser 7 weapon, which is compatible and will communicate with the Axon body worn camera technology.

City Commission Approves Demolition of Home in The Lakes Area

The Mayor and City Commission voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2022-181](#) for the demolition of a home located at 1051 South Northlake Drive, which was designed by architect Charles Reed Jr. and constructed in 1958. Extensive renovations have been made to the property over the years, and in 2021, a permit was approved for interior renovations. A subsequent site visit revealed that a significant portion of the exterior was demolished beyond the scope of the approved permit and contrary to Planning Staff comments. As such, this resolution approved an after the fact Certificate of Appropriateness with the stipulation that a historical marker be displayed on the property. Comm. Adam Gruber to Broward County Homeless Initiative Partnership Continuum of Care Board

The Mayor and City Commission nominated and voted unanimously to appoint Comm. Adam Gruber to fill the City of Hollywood's seat on the Broward County Continuum of Care (CoC) Board, which supports the City's strategy to address homelessness in the City. Comm. Gruber joins Officer Dwayne Chung, who has been nominated to serve as Hollywood's law enforcement representative on the CoC board.

ORDINANCES

Ordinance Amendment to Allow Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages in City Community Facilities Approved

The Mayor and City Commission approved Ordinance [PO-2022-11](#) to allow consumption or sale of alcoholic beverages at any of the City's community centers or facilities. This ordinance amendment allows alcoholic beverages at the City's indoor Park Facilities, Golf Courses (both indoor and outdoor) and Arts and Cultural Center (indoors).

PRESENTATIONS, PROCLAMATIONS AND AWARDS

Recognition of Canada Day, July 1, 2022

The Mayor and City Commission presented Natalija Marjanovic, Consul and Head of Political, Economic and Public Affairs, Consulate General of Canada in Miami, with a proclamation recognizing Canada Day, which is observed on July 1st. Canada Day commemorates the anniversary of the Constitution Act, which consolidated three provinces into the single nation of Canada in 1867. The holiday was originally designated as Dominion Day. Dominions were a term that was used to refer to one of the self-governing countries under the British Empire.



Recognition of National Boys & Girls Club Week, June 25-July 1, 2022

In recognition of National Boys & Girls Club Week, the Mayor and Commission presented Michelle White, County Director of the Boys & Girls Club of Broward County, Marti Huizenga Unit, with a proclamation to honor the organization for its comprehensive and effective services that help develop future leaders. The Boys & Girls Club in Hollywood provides a safe place and services to more than 1,000 youth annually. Recognition of Juneteenth Day, June 19, 2022

Georgette Lasley, Founding Member of Juneteenth South Broward, accepted a proclamation in recognition of Juneteenth - the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the end of slavery in the United States. The origin of Juneteenth began in 1865 on June 19th in Galveston, Texas and pays tribute to the day Union General Gordon Granger and 2,000 federal troops arrived in Galveston to take possession of the state and enforce slaves' new freedoms. Juneteenth is also known as African American Emancipation Day and



is celebrated throughout the United States and beyond. Juneteenth is a time for reflection, rejoicing, assessment, self-improvement and planning for the future. The celebration of Juneteenth unites people of all races, religions, and creeds through unity and understanding. 2021 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report

Moises Ariza from Marcum, LLP presented the City's Fiscal Year 2021 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report and audit results. The City received an unqualified opinion which means the financial statements are free of material misstatements and presented in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. The City was issued a clean audit report with no findings and no deficiencies in internal control. This is a significant accomplishment and a direct result of the hard work and commitment from the Finance Department and City staff to maintain the highest level of professionalism and fiscal responsibility. GRANTS

PRCA Applies for After School Child Care Program Grant

The Mayor and City Commissioners voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2022-169](#) to accept, if awarded, the State of Florida's Child Care Stabilization Subgrant Program. The Department of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts operates after school childcare programs at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Kay Gaither and McNicol Community Centers and is seeking this grant for facility improvements, supplies and equipment. This grant does not require a match.

PRCA Applies for State Grant to Renovate the Armory Building

The Mayor and City Commissioners voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2022-170](#) to accept, if awarded, the Florida Department of State Division of Historical Resources 2022 Special Category Grant Program for the Armory Building renovations. The Armory Building was built in 1955, and the Department of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts would like to renovate the building to create an indoor sports facility including basketball, batting cages, soccer goals, and ADA-compliant restrooms. If awarded, this \$500,000 requires a one-to-one match which will be paid from GO Bond project funding.

PRCA Applies for Grant to Preserve the Historical Coral Rock House

The Mayor and City Commissioners voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2022-171](#) to accept, if awarded, the Florida Department of State Division of Historical Resources 2022 Historical Preservation Small Match Grant for the preservation of the Coral Rock House at Charles Vollman Park. The House was built in the 1920s, and its limestone façade is in need of preservation. If awarded, grant funding in the amount of \$50,000 will be appropriated in the FY 2023 Operating Budget.

PRCA Applies for State Grant to Support ArtsPark Concert Series

The Mayor and City Commissioners voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2022-172](#) to accept, if awarded, the Florida Department of State Division of Art and Culture 2022 General Program Support Grant for additional concerts, events and promotion of the ArtsPark Concert Series. If awarded, grant funding in the amount of \$100,000 will be appropriated in the FY 2023 Operating Budget.

- **Enhanced Parking Enforcement & Towing Operation Begins Thursday, June 23rd:** Due to railway, pedestrian and other safety concerns, an enhanced parking enforcement and towing operation will be taking place along Dixie Highway and N. 21st Avenue from Sheridan Street to Hollywood Boulevard beginning on Thursday, June 23rd to curb illegal parking along the rail corridor. - **Alert Hollywood:** The City has launched a new emergency notification system called Alert Hollywood. Used by many government agencies throughout Florida, Alert Hollywood notifies residents through phone calls, e-mails and/or text messages to mobile phones of an emergency in the community such as a hurricane watch or warning, flash flood warning, tornado warning, serious police situations and other critical incidents.

Now that we are in Hurricane season, it's particularly important that residents visit the City's website to access the Alert Hollywood registration page. On the registration page, you simply click on the "Sign Up" link located just below the login fields. Once you submit your information, you will receive Alert Hollywood notifications whenever an alert is issued. Alerts may be received by phone and/or email address. Severe weather alerts issued by the National Weather Service are automatically issued through the Alert Hollywood system if you choose to receive those notifications.

The Alert Hollywood service is free to the public, but text message fees charged by your wireless carrier may apply depending on your mobile phone plan.

- **6th Annual Juneteenth Celebration:** The City will partner with Juneteenth South Broward on Sunday, June 19th to present a free family event at the ArtsPark at Young Circle from 3 p.m. to 9 p.m. in celebration of freedom. The 6th Annual Juneteenth Celebration will feature stilt walkers, a junkanoo band, fire dancer, a black history display, and a kids corner along with food and music.
- **Father's Day Kids Fishing Tournament This Weekend:** The City of Hollywood Father's Day Kids Fishing Tournament is scheduled for Saturday, June 18, 2022 at Holland Park at 801 Johnson Street in Hollywood. Although registration is closed, onlookers may attend the event. Awards will be given for Largest Fish, Smallest Fish, Most Unusual Fish and Most Fish. Check in begins at 8 a.m., lines down at 9:30 a.m. and awards will be presented at 12 p.m.
