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## CITY COMMISSION MEETING

### **City Commission Approves Purchase of Two High-Water Rescue Vehicles**

The Mayor and Commission voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2023-014](#) to purchase two High-Water Rescue Vehicles. These vehicles assist rescuers to evacuate civilians from areas that are partially underwater, or about to be underwater. In response to Hurricane Ian's impact on the west coast of Florida, our barrier island, and flood-prone areas in the City of Hollywood, Fire Rescue would like to purchase two (2) additional High-Water Rescue Vehicles.

### **Commission Approves Legislative Agenda for Upcoming State Legislative Session**

Adam Reichbach, Assistant City Manager for Finance and Administration, presented the City's 2023 State Legislative Priorities to the Mayor and City Commission. Redistricting took place in 2022 and as a result, we have two senators and two representatives representing Hollywood. City staff, in partnership with Joseph Salzberg and Jason Unger of Gray Robinson, will work with Senators Lauren Book and Jason Pizzo and Representatives Marie Woodson and Hillary Cassel to monitor bills that may impact the City of Hollywood and our residents.

Resolution [R-2023-031](#) was approved unanimously. The priorities include, but are not limited to the following:

- Affordable (Attainable) Housing Programs/Funding
  - Cybersecurity Resources
  - Economic Development Funding Opportunities
  - Home Rule Preservation
  - Resiliency Measures/Funding
  - Septic to Sewer Conversion Funding
  - Sovereign Immunity
  - Vacation Rentals Regulations
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Priority funding includes our state appropriations requests for the Johnson Street/Memorial Regional Hospital C-10 Canal Bridge Widening in the amount of \$950,000. In addition, the City has been working with BTI and their lobbying partners on an additional state appropriation request pertaining to the Hollywood Blvd roadway bifurcation as part of the proposed Block 57 redevelopment project.

The 2023 Legislative Session is set to begin on March 7<sup>th</sup> and continue through May 5<sup>th</sup>. Committee Weeks are taking place now through February 24<sup>th</sup>.

### **New Members Appointed to Education Advisory Committee and Marine Advisory Board**

The Mayor and Commission voted unanimously to appoint Brooke Manasse as a Student Alternate to the Education Advisory Committee (EAC). The EAC promotes and supports quality educational opportunities in the City and seeks to make sure the opportunities in Hollywood are among the best available in the State of Florida.

The Mayor and Commission also appointed Julie Greenfield, Robert Hogg, and David Ide to the Marine Advisory Board. The Marine Advisory Board identifies goals and objectives on an annual basis and provides input to develop ways to increase revenue from the marine industries sector in the City.

## **ORDINANCES**

### **Ordinance Amending Chapter 133 Pertaining to Antisemitism and Bias-Motivated Crimes**

The Mayor and City Commission voted unanimously to approve Ordinance [PO-2022-25](#) to amend Chapter 133 of the Code of Ordinances that regulates offenses against public peace and safety within the City to include antisemitism and bias-motivated crimes.

Jews are consistently one of the most targeted religious communities in the United States, and antisemitic incidents are being reported at record levels. Unfortunately, Broward County, home to the third-largest population of Holocaust survivors in the world, has not been immune to antisemitism. This ordinance amendment adopts a working definition of antisemitism and establishes its intent that the definitions of bias-motivated crimes and antisemitism be considered in determining the motivation behind a violation of law would help fight the serious, pervasive, and enduring problem of antisemitism and benefit the entire community.



## GRANTS

### **Commission Accepts Resilient Florida Program Grants for Pump Station and Swale Restoration**

The Mayor and City Commission voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2023-033](#) to accept \$1.825 million from the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection for the Resilient Florida Program Grant for the A1A Stormwater Pump Stations project. The A1A Pump Station Project will entail installing four stormwater pump stations along A1A at Bouganvilla Terrace, Franklin, Sherman, and Van Buren Streets. This project is a joint effort of the Department of Public Utilities, the Hollywood Community Redevelopment Agency Beach District, Broward County and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT).

The Mayor and City Commission voted unanimously to approve Resolution [R-2023-027](#) to accept the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Resilient Florida Program Grant in the amount of \$326,650.00 for the City's Recapture the Swale Program. Swales are a key component of the stormwater management system that helps protect the environment by filtering runoff pollutants, providing temporary rainwater storage, and reducing flooding. With a total cost of \$695,000.00, the Department of Public Utilities is in the process of restoring swales across the City.

### **Ratification of Grant Applications Submitted by Police Department**

The Mayor and Commission unanimously approved the ratification of two grant applications that were submitted by the Hollywood Police Department. Resolution [R-2023-020](#) ratifies the application submission to the 2022 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program. If awarded, grant funds in the amount of \$37,948.00 will be used to purchase Police technology equipment. The JAG program is administered through Broward Sheriff's Office as the local facilitating law enforcement agency.

Resolution [R-2023-022](#) ratifies the application, which was submitted to the Gary Sinise Foundation for the First Responder Grant in the amount of \$21,837.00 to purchase medical mass casualty trauma kits.

### **Police Department Applies for The Florida Fish And Wildlife Conservation Commission Derelict Vessel Removal Program Grant**

The Mayor and City Commission unanimously approved Resolution [R-2023-021](#) to accept, if awarded, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation (FWC) Commission Derelict Vessel Removal Program Grant in the amount of \$316,250.00. This grant will allow the Police Department to partner with FWC to address the removal and proper disposal of derelict vessels from waterways.

- **Safe Streets Summit:** City/CRA staff are working with staff from the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and its partners to prepare for the upcoming Safe Streets Summit being held at the Diplomat Resort here in Hollywood on Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>. There will be three mobile tours in Hollywood for summit attendees that will providing a unique view of transportation initiatives designed to provide safe and accessible streets. One tour will feature the bike lane improvements in West Hollywood along with the planned US 441 mobility hub and linear park. Another will highlight the walkability of Downtown Hollywood from City Hall Circle to Young Circle, and the third will feature investments in made to improve the Hollywood Beach Broadwalk and address resiliency in transportation infrastructure on the barrier island. This year Mayor Levy will be recognized for his support of Complete Streets initiatives at a luncheon on Friday, February 3.

- **New Episode of the MPO's "Let's Talk Transportation" Podcast features Commissioner Shuham:** As part of the MPO's promotion of the upcoming Summit to be held here in Hollywood, Commissioner Shuham, who serves as the City's appointee on the MPO Board, was featured in the latest episode of the MPO's podcast "Let's Talk Transportation." The topic is the ABC's of adaptation, bikes and commuting and is hosted each month by MPO Executive Director Greg Stuart. - **Update on US 441 Affordable Housing Proposal:** The lottery numbers from the Florida Housing Finance Corporation were assigned and Residences at Beverly Park by NuRock received the top lottery number for 9% Federal Low Income Housing Tax Credits available for multi-family development in Broward County. On Wednesday, the review committee considered all of the applications and its recommendation will now go to the FHFC board for its review and approval later this month. There is a built-in period for challenges, but NuRock has let staff know, they will begin moving ahead with the development review process for 115 units of affordable housing to be built behind the Wells Fargo bank building at US 441 and Washington Street.
- **Call for Artists – City of Hollywood COVID Memorial:** The City of Hollywood is seeking to commission an artist or artist team to design, fabricate and install a site-specific memorial to recognize those lost to COVID; and to honor the healthcare workers and first responders who dedicated their lives to the care of COVID patients.

The planned location for the memorial is Kiwanis Park at 3400 Johnson Street. The Memorial will be placed in the southeast corner of the park and interested artists are encouraged to visit the site before submitting their applications. The deadline for applications is February 8<sup>th</sup>. The Application Form that can be found at [www.hollywoodfl.org](http://www.hollywoodfl.org) under Hollywood Happenings.

- **Operation Paintbrush:** The City of Hollywood Department of Public Works is holding Operation Paintbrush this Saturday, January 21st from 8 a.m. until noon. Operation Paintbrush provides up to 20 gallons of high-quality exterior latex paint for free to single-family homeowners and non-profit organizations in Hollywood. One hundred percent of the latex paint collected through the Broward County Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program is recycled into new, high-quality exterior paint which is then provided to participating cities at no cost. Paint can be picked up at the Department of Public Works, 1600 S. Park Road in Hollywood beginning at 8 a.m. Distribution is on a first-come, first-served basis while the City's supply lasts. To participate, you must provide your current driver's license with Hollywood address and a current utility bill as proof of Hollywood residency. The paint colors offered are off-white, beige, terracotta, gray, and turquoise.
- **Construction Underway:** There are a lot of construction projects underway in the City and we hope our residents have signed up for the City's weekly email notifications so they can get updates on these projects as well as the contact information for the construction team and the assigned City project manager should they have any questions. Here's a quick overview:

***New Privacy Wall Construction on 46th Ave:*** As part of Hollywood's voter-approved General Obligation Bond, contractor MBR Construction, Inc. is installing 900 linear feet of precast concrete privacy wall along N 46th Ave. from N Hills Drive to Stirling Road. The wall will be constructed at the rear of the property in the public right-of-way. This is anticipated to take approximately two months. Property owners are asked to assist crews by removing any personal belongings from the construction area.

**Park Renovations: Stan Goldman Park Dog Park (South) Restrooms** plumbing renovations are in progress. Restrooms are closed. Guests may utilize Skatepark restrooms.

Asphalt work started at **Zinkil Park**. The park and playground are closed during this project. Zinkil Park parking lot will be closed next week, January 23rd - 27th. Vehicles must be removed from the parking lot before 6 p.m. Sunday, January 22nd.

The **Holland Park** restroom renovation is underway. The renovation is expected to run through mid-January. While the restroom is under construction, portable restrooms will be provided.

**John Williams Park and Parking Lot** – will be closed next week, January 23rd - 27th. Vehicles must be removed from the parking lot before 6 p.m. Sunday, January 22nd.

Construction is now complete at **Mara Berman Giuliani Park** and the park, along with the new Yandy Chirino playground reopened for the community to use earlier today.

Construction is also now complete at **Joe DiMaggio Park** and the park has reopened.

**Roadway Projects: US1/Federal Highway FDOT Mobility Improvement Project** -Construction is anticipated to start this month on the US1/Federal Highway Mobility Improvement Project which includes:

- Milling and resurfacing
- Modifying pavement marking to accommodate 4-foot bicycle lanes
- Installing 138 new light poles and upgrading existing lighting to LED
- Replacing concrete sidewalk with pavers from Monroe Street to Van Buren Street, and from Polk Street to Fillmore Street
- Removing existing pavers at signalized intersections between Van Buren Street and Pembroke Road and installing decorative stamped asphalt crosswalks at all signalized intersections
- During this project there will be lane closure in the overnight hours from Sunday through Thursday, between 10:30 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. and we also expect two-hour single lane closures between 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. for concrete pours. At times access to side streets will be limited due to the construction of the decorative crosswalks.
- This is a \$7.1 million dollar construction project to improve this roadway with additional details available on the City's website.

**North 26th Avenue (Taft to Sheridan) Resurfacing Project:** The North 26th Avenue Resurfacing Project is underway along North 26th Avenue between Taft Street and Sheridan Street. Sidewalk repair and swale restoration, followed by the roadway milling and resurfacing work are taking place this month.

This construction project includes swale restoration, milling and resurfacing of the existing road, new pavement markings, and sidewalk replacement within the project boundaries. The works is scheduled to take approximately 60 days to complete, pending weather or other unforeseen circumstances.

Access to private property will be maintained, however driveway access will be limited following a concrete pour to allow for the concrete to cure. To accommodate the inconvenience, temporary parking in the swale area adjacent to private property will be permitted while driveway access is temporarily closed. Closures are not expected to last longer than 48 hours.

**Liberty Street Surtax Rehabilitation and Maintenance Construction Project Underway:** Construction is underway along Liberty Street between North Park Road and North 31st Road, as well

as on a section of North 31st Road just south of Liberty Street. This construction project includes storm drain upgrades, swale restoration, milling and resurfacing of the existing road, new pavement markings, and sidewalk replacement. The work is scheduled to take place through February 2023.

Access to private property will be maintained, however driveway access will be limited following concrete pours to allow for the concrete to cure. In order to accommodate the inconvenience, temporary parking in the swale area adjacent to private property will be allowed while driveway access is temporarily closed. Closures are not expected to last longer than 48 hours.

- **Window to Apply for City Agency Grants is Now Open:** The City of Hollywood is accepting applications from Non-Profit Organizations for the Fiscal Year 2024 for both the General Fund Social Service Agency Grant Program and the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program to provide public services. The City will be collecting and reviewing the agency applications and making funding recommendations to the City Commission. Programs must demonstrate a significant benefit to Hollywood residents. The City is interested in supporting creative and innovative projects and programs that best serve the community.
